

West Lindsey District Council
Regulation 18 - Decision Statement - Referendum
Bishop Norton and Atterby Neighbourhood Plan

1.1 Under Regulation 18 of the Neighbourhood Planning (General) Regulations 2012, West Lindsey District Council has produced this 'Decision Statement' in relation to the Bishop Norton and Atterby Neighbourhood Plan submitted to them by Bishop Norton and Atterby Parish Council.

1.2 Following an independent examination of written representations, West Lindsey District Council now confirms that the Neighbourhood Plan will proceed to a neighbourhood planning referendum.

1.3 In accordance with the examiner's recommendation, the Neighbourhood Plan will proceed to a public referendum to be held on 6 May 2021 based on the Bishop Norton and Atterby Neighbourhood Area as approved by West Lindsey District Council on 16 May 2016. Background

2.1 In early 2016, Bishop Norton and Atterby Parish Council submitted a request to West Lindsey District Council for the designation of the Parish of Bishop Norton and Atterby as a Neighbourhood Area. The approval of the Neighbourhood Area Designation, for the Bishop Norton and Atterby Neighbourhood Plan, was made on the 16 May 2016.

2.2 The Parish Council carried out consultation on the Draft pre-Submission Neighbourhood Plan for Bishop Norton and Atterby in August/September 2019. Consultation on the Submission version of the Neighbourhood Plan was undertaken from January to March 2020.

2.4 An independent examiner was appointed to undertake the examination of the Submission version of the Bishop Norton and Atterby Neighbourhood Plan and the examiner's report was completed on 28 September 2020 and made available to the Parish Council and District Council.

2.5 West Lindsey District Council officers, under delegated powers, have determined that the recommended modifications to the Bishop Norton and Atterby Neighbourhood Plan meet the 'basic conditions' as set out in section 38A of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004. West Lindsey District Council and Bishop Norton and Atterby Parish Council agreed that all of the recommended modifications made by the independent examiner be included and revised in the original Neighbourhood Plan in order for it to proceed to public referendum.

2.6 To meet the requirements of the Localism Act 2011, a referendum to be held on 6 May 2021, will pose the following question.

"Do you want West Lindsey District Council to use the Neighbourhood Plan for Bishop Norton and Atterby to help it decide planning applications in the neighbourhood area?"

2.7 In response to the COVID-19 situation the Government has updated current planning guidance to set out that where a decision statement has been made detailing the intention to send a neighbourhood plan to referendum, such as for the Bishop Norton

and Atterby Neighbourhood Plan, that plan can be given significant weight in planning decision-making, so far as the plan is material to the application.
