[Members' clubs and miners' welfare institutes may site up to three machines from categories B3A, B4, C or D (only one can be B3A) with a club gaming machine permit, for which there is a different application form].

## **Notes**

- 1. This form is to be used for the notification of up to two gaming machines of categories C and/or D under Section 282 of the Gambling Act 2005, or for the conversion of an existing Section 34 gaming machine permit under the Gaming Act 1968, or for a new application/variation/transfer of a gaming machine permit (for three or more category C and/or D gaming machines at a premises) under the Gambling Act 2005.
- 2. The premises must be licensed under the Licensing Act 2003 to sell alcohol for consumption on the premises, without the requirement that alcohol is served only with food and there must be a bar for serving alcohol to customers on the premises.
- 3. The gaming machines must be located on these licensed premises.
- **4.** A 'premises licence holder' is a person holding a premises licence under the Licensing Act 2003.
- 5. There is no statutory limit to the number of machines which may be applied for although the licensing authority has some discretion in this regard so you may wish to check if there is a local policy to consider and whether applications for certain numbers of machines are decided by a hearing. It should also be noted that, should the premises be mainly used for making gaming machines available, the licensing authority can cancel the permit or vary the number of machines for use on the premises (schedule 13, paragraph 16 of the Gambling Act 2005).
- **6.** Sections 282 and 283 of the Gambling Act 2005 detail two types of gaming machines which can be located in alcohol licensed premises:

Category C: Maximum stake = 50p / Maximum prize = £35

**Category D**: Maximum stake = 10p (or 30p non-monetary) Maximum prize = £5 cash (or £8 non-monetary)

- 7. All alcohol licensed premises which provide gaming machines for use on the premises must comply with any relevant Code of Practice issued by the Gambling Commission under Section 24 of the Gambling Act 2005. The 'code of practice for gaming machines in clubs and premises with an alcohol licence' is available via the Gambling Commission's website at:

- **8.** This licensing authority must notify the applicant of its grant / refusal of the application for a permit as soon as is reasonably practicable after the decision has been made.
- **9.** The accompanying fee required for a **notification** of intention to have up to two gaming machines is £50 and there is <u>no annual fee payable</u> in the following years.

To **convert** a section 34 to a gaming machine permit costs £100.

The fee payable with this application for a **new** gaming machine permit is £150.

If requesting to **vary** an existing gaming machine permit the fee due is £100. To **transfer** a gaming machine permit costs £25.

Once a licensed premises gaming machine permit is granted, the permit's duration is indefinite as it is linked to the Licensing Act 2003 premises licence. An annual fee of £50 is payable each year on/before the anniversary of the date that the permit was issued. Failure to pay the annual fee may result in the cancellation of the permit.

**10.** Where you are notifying the licensing authority of two machines or less, you may wish to request an acknowledgement of receipt for your application. Please email <a href="mailto:licensing@west-lindsey.gov.uk">licensing@west-lindsey.gov.uk</a> for written confirmation.
